<b>7.</b>	January 2025 meeting agenda.  NATIONAL GRID – LION LINK INTERCONNECTOR	
	Following the Parish Meeting on 25th October on the same day as Lionlink's failed attempt to reach their proposed survey site at Walberswick, Dennis Cox took advice from DTT's land agent, Hayden Foster from Clarke and Simpson. There was strong feeling at the Parish Meeting that Lionlink had caused damage to the beach with one idea being to padlock DTT's beach gate to prevent further access. Hayden Foster thought there were no grounds to terminate the gate access contract for this national infrastructure project.  DTT obtained an apology from Lionlink for the disruption and inconvenience caused to Dunwich, and Dennis circulated their apology to the Chair of the Parish Meeting. Lionlink raked back the shingle on the beach which left it in the same condition as before their heavy machines churned it up. DC also circulated Lionlink's letter advising they will not attempt to reach Walberswick again this year, via the DTT gate. The trustees noted that Dunwich Town Trust is responsible to the Charity Commissioners and not to the Parish Meeting.	
8.	BEACH AND CAR PARK  Use of Car Park Policy and Public Liability Insurance  Dennis said he wanted a car park policy to ensure DTT has control over knowing when large events are occurring that fill up the car park. In the light of recent difficulties when the cycle event took place the trust want to establish a generic car park contract as used by DTT with Sauna Box. DC will lead on the project and wants the contract to be sent to major stakeholders like the Church, the Museum, Greyfriars Trust, Flora Tea Rooms to ensure this policy is publicly known and used. The contract establishes a principle of legality, ensures public liability and health and safety are covered. The trustees believe that the primary purpose of the car park is to create a space where people can park and enjoy Dunwich during the day. Having a booking system for large events will benefit stakeholders such as Flora Tea Room who lose business if the car park is too full. Flora Tea Rooms lease a part of the car park, it was unclear how much. Sharon will send Dennis the Sauna Box Contract together with information on our Public Liability Insurance and health and safety cover. Dennis to prepare draft car park policy for next meeting	DC

## Consideration of Winter Pop up Café

The trustees discussed allowing one to set up in the winter when the Flora Tea Rooms are closed. They decided it should be a tasteful type van selling good coffee and drinks rather than a burger type van. PB will approach the Flora Tea Rooms to see if they are interested in running a caravan take away service in the winter. As DTT has a lot of projects going on – there were no plans to set up the café this winter.

#### Paling Fence

The trustees decided to go ahead with Jeff Redgrave's quotation to repair the broken section of the existing fence and to install a second paling fence 1 metre away towards the sea. They chose Jeff's quote with the palings closer together as these would offer more strength and be more difficult for people to pull out for beach barbecues. The trustees decided to invite Mick Palmer to the January meeting to talk for 15 minutes at the start of the meeting sharing his knowledge about the value of the fence and beach defences. DC said it should not be for any longer because the agenda will be full with much to discuss. The beach is not eroding too badly as JH explained that an offshore sandbank if taking the force out of the waves but the paling fence will add strength to the cliff wall as well.
